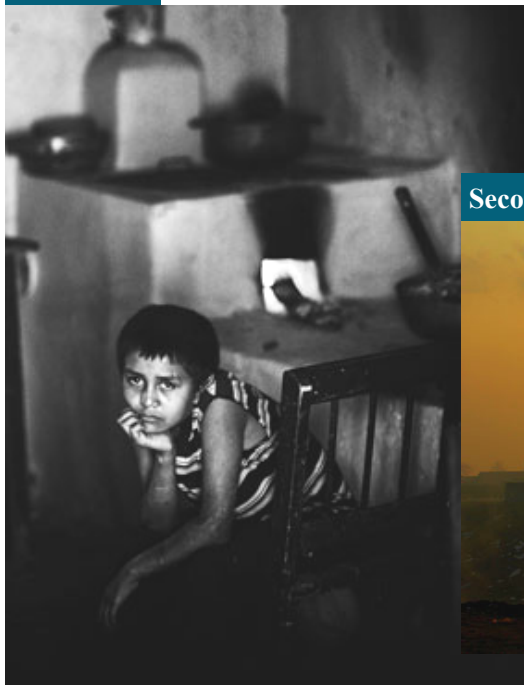


Our Speaker Today
